

2011 Updates for Appendices 1 - 9

January 4, 2011

Please read the note below so you will not miss any updates for your state:

Appendices 1 and 5 have few changes so only the items that have changed are listed in this update (see below). If your state is not listed, there are no changes.

Appendix 4 has no changes.

Appendices 2 and 3 have been updated based on the 2010 census. Appendices 6, 7, and 8 (weather and economy information) have many changes due to the constant fluctuation in these areas. These appendices are included in their entirety. Your state may or may not reflect a change in these areas. Please feel free to print these appendices and use them to answer the questions in the Student Booklet and/or Fifty States Under God; but please keep in mind that the industry paragraphs in the Student Booklet will reflect the information that was current at the time your book was printed. You will need to explain this discrepancy to your students in order to avoid confusing them. You should make it clear to your student which answer you will accept on quizzes and tests. If you want the new information, you will need to correct your answer key as well. You will also note that a new category has been added to Appendix 7 (Transportation/Communication). This category was previously included under Utilities. If your students use the updated Appendix 7 to fill out the graph in Lesson 25, they will need to combine the Transportation/Communication percentage with the Utilities percentage and record the resulting number in the Utilities category on their graph.

Appendix 9, which applies to everyone, needs to have the current President added to the list as follows: Barack H Obama, born in Hawaii, inaugurated in 2009.

Updates to Appendix 1:

Rhode Island's nickname is now listed as "The Ocean State" instead of "Little Rhody."

Updates to Appendix 5:
